It features a recreated turn-of-the-century village, an agricultural museum and the Nelson Dewey homestead. Witness a breathtaking scene at the summit of the Nelson Dewey State Park! The scenic bluffs and trails offer camping, incredible hiking, bird watching and fantastic photo opportunities! Enjoy a picture perfect view of the majestic Mississippi at Riverside Park. Take a ride on the Cassville Car Ferry, the oldest ferry service in Wisconsin. Visualize a twenty-three year old Nelson Dewey making his first trip across the Mississippi to reach the little village that was envisioned to become the first capital of the Wisconsin Territory! Come to the River and experience Cassville!

Bagley:

It is a popular riverside destination in the summer, when the population can quadruple.*

*This unincorporated community sits right next to the Mississippi River. The Wyalusing State Park is situated at the junction
of the Mississippi River and Wisconsin River. There are hardwood and pine forests, bluffs and wetlands. Many forest
animals typical of Wisconsin take refuge here, along with seasonal migratory birds.*

HISTORIC SITE

Stonefield



Nelson Dewey, Wisconsin's first governor, farmed this land. He had high hopes for this pastoral stretch of land nestled between the Mississippi River and the spectacular limestone bluffs that tower above it. He called his beloved riverside agricultural estate Stonefield. While his farming enterprise faded into history, the name he gave it lives on at a historic site that pays homage to Dewey and the history of agriculture in Wisconsin.

Return to Stonefield's historic roots on a guided tour of Governor Nelson Dewey's home site, offering a sweeping vista overlooking a re-created 1900 rural farming village beside the Mississippi River.

Visit a 1900 farmstead and stroll quiet village streets lined with thirty historic shops and businesses. Explore the State Agricultural Museum, which tells the story of Wisconsin's agriculture from before farm mechanization, through the rise and fall of wheat farming and the advent of the dairy industry, and into the 20th century. See Wisconsin's largest collection of historic farm implements ranging from incredibly detailed miniature McCormick patent models to full-size tractors, reapers and threshing machines. The museum's extensive exhibits include an Allis-Chalmers Model U tractor, the first rubber tire tractor produced, and the 1896 McCormick Auto-mower, the oldest existing tractor in North America.

Step inside Governor Dewey's historic 1870 stone barn and peruse the museum shop's full line of books, note cards, candies, arts-and-crafts items and other souvenirs marking back to Wisconsin's agricultural heyday.

Stonefield is one of the newest Great River Road Interpretive Centers and features a new exhibit, "River Connections," which tells the story of the site's connections to the Mississippi River.

Stonefield Historic Site is located one mile north of Cassville, WI on Cty. Hwy. V V

CAMPING

Grant River Recreation Area

The Army Corps of Engineers Recreation Area is a class A campground located two miles south of Potosi/Tennyson, WI, along the Mississippi River off Hwy. 133. Barges on the mighty Mississippi pass peacefully by with the silence interrupted by an occasional train.

Open from mid-April until late October, the recreation area has 73 campsites-63 with electricity. Water, dump station, restrooms and showers are available. The Grant River Recreation Area also has such amenities as playgrounds, boat dock, fishing, covered shelters, picnic areas and interpretive programs periodically on weekends making it a popular family getaway.

Canoeing

Grant County offers wonderful opportunities to canoe, kayak or tube on one of its scenic waterways. Rich with history, abundant in wildlife and serene, the rivers of Grant County await with adventure for the whole family. Along the mighty Mississippi or the somewhat tricky Wisconsin, there are frequent islands or other places for the canoeer to stop and camp. The Grant, Little Platte, Big Platte and Wisconsin abound with bends and rapids to challenge the canoeer or kayaker. The rapids in the two smaller rivers are all Class 1 and are suitable for beginners and family groups. 100's of miles of streams and nature. The Grant River empties into the mighty Mississippi River, up river from Potosi.

Cross Country Skiing

Over 7 miles of groomed trails are available at Wyalusing State Park at 13342 Cty. Hwy. CC, south of Prairie du Chien, WI. Toilets and water are available and a park sticker is required.

Fishing

Nothing tastes better than fresh caught fish that you've pulled from the river yourself. Especially when it's caught in the natural beauty that is Grant County. The Lower Wisconsin and Mississippi Rivers form 110 miles of river frontage on the northern and western boundaries of Grant County.

Some of the Midwest's premier fishing spots are found in Grant County. The combination of steep cliffs, rolling hills and valleys with numerous streams and rivers flowing through the county's heartland make this one of the Midwest's richest wildlife opportunities.

The Mississippi River is known for its excellent pan fish, large & smallmouth bass, walleye, northern, sauger and all species of catfish. This major American waterway has provided travelers with reliable transportation and settlers livelihood for many generations.

On the ever-changing Wisconsin River, anglers vie for northern, blue gills, smallmouth bass, catfish, walleye, sturgeon and sauger. Some of Midwest's premier fishing spots are found in Grant County.

Whether your preference is viewing, hunting or fishing, the rugged terrain provides ample cover to witness the beauty of Grant County wildlife.





Sinsinawa

Community History:

Sinsinawa is an unincorporated community in Grant County, one mile north of the border with Illinois. The town is best known for being the mother house of the Sinsinawa Dominican Sisters. The community's name means either "rattlesnake" or "Home of the Young Eagle" in Sioux. The first white settler in the area was George Wallace Jones, who purchased land for a lead smelter in 1827. He soon sold the land to Samuel Mazzuchelli, who subsequently built a men's college in 1846. Mazzuchelli founded the Sinsinawa Dominican Sisters in 1847. This religious order founded a women's college and high school in Sinsinawa in 1865. Sinsinawa Mound is a cone-shaped hill in the area, from which the area gets its name. Sinsinawa Creek runs along the hill south towards the Fever River in Illinois.

Nearby Attractions

Kieler:

Located about seven miles northeast of the Iowa-Wisconsin border. The community was named after John Kieler, an immigrant from Prussia who arrived in the area in 1855. Immaculate Conception, the only Catholic church in Kieler, was constructed in 1858. The church was remodeled in 1896, when a rock exterior and two front towers were added. A 2004 addition includes a large gathering area on the west side.

Hazel Green:

The first permanent settlement in Wisconsin was in Hazel Green in 1825. In 1831, Lucius Lyon began surveying just south of the present day Hazel Green in southwestern Wisconsin. This is the place where all land that was to become Wisconsin would be measured. Today, every property deed in Wisconsin includes a description which is based on the Point of Beginning (POB). The village has several bed and breakfasts and antique shops to offer history enthusiasts and antique shoppers. Hazel Green is "close enough, but far enough away" to regional population centers such as Dubuque, IA, Galena, IL and Platteville, WI. Come spend a winter weekend with us after hitting the slopes at one of the ski resorts located within 20 minutes of Hazel Green. The Village boasts a beautiful recreation park, as well as a recently enhanced Memorial Park. Golf courses and pools are located nearby.

Platteville Trails

- Pecatonica Trail: A 10 mile trail situated in the Bonner Branch Valley connects Belmont with the Cheese Country Trail, another 47 mile long trail heading east.

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

Dickeyville

The Village of Dickeyville is home to the renowned Dickeyville Grotto. The works of Father Matthias Wernerus, a Catholic Priest, Pastor of the Parish from 1918 to 1931. His handiwork in stone, built from 1925-1930, is dedicated to the unity of two great American ideals-love of God and love of Country. These religious and patriotic shrines were constructed without the use of blueprints. Located about seven miles northeast of the Wisconsin-Iowa border, it's a creation in stone, mortar and bright colored objects-collected materials from all over the world. These include colored glass, gems, antique heirlooms of pottery or porcelain, stalagmites and stalactites, sea shells, starfish, petrified sea urchins and fossils, and a variety of corals, amber glass, agate, quartz, ores, such as iron, copper and lead, fool's gold, rock crystals, onyx, amethyst and coal, petrified wood and moss. The shrines are located in a beautiful floral garden area surrounding the Holy Ghost Church.

Highways and Byways

Grant County, Wisconsin, offers so much in the way of scenic drive time that you could be a resident and never finish discovering delightful new paths to its inner beauty.

Our northern boundary is marked by the dark and ever-changing Wisconsin River. State Highway 133 and County Highway C wind alongside its undeveloped public lands. Camping is allowed on state-owned islands and shores. The lower Wisconsin River provides explorers miles of secluded backwaters, islands and sandy beaches to discover.

To our west is the legendary Mississippi River. Several state and county highways take you to many boat landings and to opportunities for hiking, camping and wildlife observation. The bluffs that line our rivers and streams are adorned with a variety of tree, plant and flower species.

Wildlife is abundant. Deer are especially evident during early morning and early evening times – so proceed with caution. Grant County is a bird-watching paradise and birds of all kinds can be seen, especially the great American Bald Eagle.

The Great River Road winds through 60 miles of beautiful Grant County and its riverside communities. Stop to stretch your legs at either of our famous state parks – Nelson Dewey or Wyalusing - both of which feature trails, restroom facilities, camping and picnic areas for your enjoyment.

Our unglaciated and pastoral landscapes can be investigated more closely by state-designated Rustic Roads. Some in Grant County include Scenic, Sleepy Hollow and Liberty Ridge Roads. The Irish Ridge Road between Potosi and Cassville offers beautiful and memorable views.

Love rural life? If you don't mind

sharing the roads during planting and harvest seasons with tractors and horse-drawn buggies, you've come to the right place! It's well worth your patience to view the patchwork of fields, hardwood stands and streams that earmark our great county.

Grant County is steeped in history and much of it is evident in many of our historic downtowns. Great care has been taken to preserve a number of these historic buildings. Stop and say "hello," whether you are staying in or passing through Grant County. We're sure the qualities that give the Midwest its good name will be evident in the people you meet. Old churches and farms, cemeteries, breweries, one-room school houses and mines dot our landscape as monuments to our founding fathers. Museums adorn many of our towns, with stories of "days gone by" ready to be told to every willing ear.



Community History:

Lancaster is the county seat of Grant County. Located in the extreme southwest corner of Wisconsin, the Mississippi River forms the area's western edge. The discovery of lead, or "mineral" in the region during the early part of the nineteenth century made Grant County one of the earliest centers of population in the state and the Midwest.

Grant County was created by the first territorial legislature. Lancaster owes its stature as county seat to its central location in the county.

Historical Facts:

Lancaster is home to the first publicly conceived civil war monument, dedicated in 1867. Nelson Dewey, Wisconsin's first governor was from Lancaster and is buried there. Lancaster's architectural treasures include the Patrick Kinney House, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright, Dave Schreiner, the first All American from the University of Wisconsin was also from Lancaster. Pleasant Ridge, just outside of the city limits was first settled by freed slaves. Pleasant Ridge was one of the first integrated schools in the Nation.

The "Blue Boy" Civil War statue on the courthouse square in Lancaster is one of only two like it in the nation. The statue has a fountain attached, which was put there in 1906 by the Women's Relief Corps.

National Register of Historic Places Located in the heart of downtown Boscobel is the Boscobel Hotel. Built in 1863 and originally known as the Central House, this three-story native limestone landmark

is now listed on the State and National Register of Historic Places. The hotel etched its mark in world history in 1898 when two Christian traveling salesmen shared a room and conceived the idea of a Christian travelers' association. That meeting led to the formation of the world-famous Gideon Society, which has since placed millions of Gideon Bibles in lodging facilities throughout the world.

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
